Blackbear Bosin: “Prairie Fire”

Project: *Movement*

Materials:

- Card stock (1 per student)
- Tempera paint wash (red, orange, yellow, brown)
- Brushes
- ½ sheet card stock
- Horse or smaller animal stencil (1 per pair of students)
- Scissors
- Glue
- Black or brown markers
- Kleenex

Process:

1. Trace stencil of one large horse or two small animals on half sheet of card stock.
2. Color the animal with crayons or markers.
3. Create a sunset on full sheet of card stock. Set aside to dry.
4. Cut out stenciled horse(s) or dogs.
5. Glue to sunset.
6. Illustrate movement/motion by adding ears, tail, mane with dark marker. These should be flowing lines.

How to make this easy in a classroom – Set up a paint station where you can do the sky. In 3 bottles have diluted paint (red, orange and yellow). Have a few students come up while the others are working on their animal. Ask the student what color they want on top (i.e. yellow) – squirt a few drops and have them take a paint brush and blend it. Then continue for all colors and after they are done take a Kleenex and blend again. It helps it dry faster. They then return to their desk to glue on the animal.
