Marc Chagall was born in a small village in Russia. Chagall studied the elements of drawing, and later painting, in the studio of a local artist. Chagall was a popular and leading innovator of the twentieth century school of Paris. Huge flower bouquets, fiddlers on the roofs, floating lovers and angels, and animals with human-like characteristics dominate his rich, personal canvases. These dream-like and colorful images, reflecting themes from folklore, legend, and Chagall's own cherished memories, distinguish him as a master at conveying visual stories.

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
