Cityscape with Symmetry and Reflection

Watercolor Paper

Colored Pencils – students should have

Water colored Pencils

Kleenex

Spray bottle with water

1. Fold paper in half – Horizontally
2. Have students place paper where the fold is at the bottom. Tell them their paper needs to be “biting a friend”
3. Tell them to draw a cityscape with their regular colored pencils. Lots of color and press hard.
 - a. Use simple shapes – squares, rectangles, triangles, arches
 - b. Think of famous buildings or landmarks: Arch, Sears Tower, Eifel Tower, White House, Empire State Building
 - c. Not a lot of detail – they have to draw it twice
 - d. Make sure they bring their picture all the way down to the bottom of the fold of the paper
4. Have them put away their colored pencils.
5. Give them the appropriate colors in water color pencils.
6. Have them open their paper, turn it correctly and draw with the water color pencils the same picture.
7. When they are done have them return the water color pencils to you.
8. Give them a Kleenex and spray it twice with water.
9. Have them smear across row by row horizontally across the water color pencil side. Not too much because you could erase if you would use a lot of water.
