Franz Marc: “Deer in Forest”

Project: Tissue paper collage

Materials:

All supplies are in the closet

Card stock

Brown crayons or markers

Glue sticks

Cut scraps of red, orange, yellow tissue paper

9x13 Pan

Marbles

Black tempera

Disposable gloves

Process:

***Write Name and Teacher on Back** – very important because the drying rack is needed and distribution is a mess if they do not write their teacher and name.

1. Students draw a simple tree. Add simple deer, birds, or any other animal with a brown marker or crayon.
2. Glue tissue paper in various sizes and shapes onto tree and ground, like leaves on and off the tree.
3. Place artwork in pan and add 5 marbles that have been dipped in black tempera and roll around.

Note:

The adult holds the pan at first with disposable gloves on.

The child places their artwork in the pan.

You have the marbles in a container with black paint.

Ask the child how many marbles?

Place the marbles in the pan and give it to the student. They will roll the marbles back and forth _____ times.

Feedback from 2004---“The kids *loved* doing this project!”

It is a bit messy but it is really cool.

The drying rack will be needed and since there is one drying rack that can be moved and can only accommodate 2 classes, one class will have to put their artwork on the floor or on top of a their desks if they go to recess.
