Materials Needed – different options

Pencil

Watercolor Paper and Watercolors with Water

or

Pencil

Cardstock

Chalk

Hairspray

or

Pencil

Cardstock

Pastels

1. Bring in flowers: pictures, artificial or real
2. Study the flower and the detail. Think of it from the perspective of a bee landing on the flower. Point out the petals, the leaves, etc.
3. Have the students draw one flower on the entire paper using light pencil first. The petals or parts of the flower may not all make it on the paper – that is okay. Make it as big as possible.
4. Add color
